#### CHRISTMAS CONCERT

Tickets will be delivered to your oldest or only child on December 13<sup>th</sup>. (There will be a few extra tickets available on a first come, first served basis. Please let the office know if you would like extras <u>AFTER</u> the tickets go home. Along with your tickets, we ask that you bring a non-perishable donation for the food bank when you come to the concert. The students are looking forward to performing for you on December 18<sup>th</sup>!

#### KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

Kindergarten registration for children born in the year 2015 will take place beginning **January 20th**, **2020** from 8am - 3pm and be ongoing. Please bring your child's Birth Certificate and proof of address along when you register so copies of these documents



can be made. Every new registration must provide legal documentation before we can accept them into our school (ie. birth certificate, passport, baptismal

certificate or certification of citizenship).
Kindergarten students must register at their catchment area school. We require proof of address

when registering (ie. driver's or proof of purchase of residence or a notarized rental agreement). If you would like your child to attend a school other than their catchment area school, you must register at their catchment area school first and request a cross boundary form to fill out. This form will then be sent to the school you want your child to attend and that school will let you know if they have room to take your child. Decisions regarding cross boundary Kindergarten students may not be made until September 2020.

#### LOST AND FOUND

The lost and found box has been emptied and has been set out in the hallways for parents and students to look to see if anything belongs to them. All items will be donated to the local charity the last day before winter break.

### Mission Public Schools 2020-2021 Kindergarten Registration Procedure



#### REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL MISSION PUBLIC SCHOOLS:

We acknowledge that we work and learn on the Traditional, Ancestral, Unceded, and Shared territories of the Stó:lō people, the Matheqwí, Sq'éwlets, Qwó:ltl'el, and Leg'á:mel First Nations.

- ✓ Children **born in 2015** are eligible for Kindergarten in 2020-2021.
- ✓ <u>Proof of age is required at time of registration:</u> E.g. Birth Certificate, Passport, Permanent Residence Card, BC Services Card (Photo Version Only), Aboriginal Status Card, Certificate of Citizenship or Immigration Canada document.
  - Please Note: The BC Care Card is not acceptable proof of age.
- ✓ Proof of Residency in BC:
  - Parent's Care Card (<u>not</u> student's) / Parent's BC Services Card (<u>not</u> student's) / Driver's License / Municipal Tax Bill / Rental Agreement or Utility Bill.
- ✓ Proof of Physical Home Address (for Catchment Area Schools):

**Note:** Driver's License / Proof of Purchase of Residence / Municipal Tax Bill / Letter Stating Current Address Notarized by a Lawyer or Notary Public / Rental Agreement (accompanied with a Gas, Cable, Telephone or Hydro Bill) / Credit Card Invoice, or Mortgage Statement.

#### **CATCHMENT SCHOOLS:**

#### When & Where:

- ✓ Monday, January 20th to Friday, January 24th, 2020
- ✓ Registration must take place at your catchment elementary school.
- ✓ As a convenience to you, we have provided a fillable Registration Form for Kindergarten to Grade 12 on the website. This does not apply to our Schools of Choice (see application process below).
- ✓ **NOTE:** This is a fillable form only and must be presented in printed form, along with the required documentation (see above), to your catchment area school in order to **REGISTER** your child at that school.

#### YOUR CATCHMENT AREA:

PLEASE NOTE (<u>Sibling Registration</u>): Parents with children <u>currently attending</u> either Edwin S. Richards or Hillside Traditional Academy will be contacted to register their kindergarten-aged sibling <u>during the month of December</u> at their present school of choice.



## '8 Shopping Tips for the Holiday Season'



Always trust your instincts. If an email or an attachment seem suspicious, don't let your curiosity put your computer at risk!

It's that time of year again - holiday shopping has begun! Everyone is looking for those unique gifts, hot toys and cool electronics. Whether it is a hard-to-find toy for kids or the latest 4K smart TV, Black Friday sales seldom fail to pique the interests of even the most casual shoppers. Yet even after the chaos of Black Friday dies, both Small Business Saturday and Cyber Monday.

While it's clear that businesses are after your dollars during the holidays, you should be aware that cybercriminals are on the lookout, too. When it comes to holiday shopping, you need to be careful that you don't fall prey to these criminals. Here are some tips to follow for your holiday shopping.

#### 1. Do not use public Wi-Fi for any shopping activity.

Public Wi-Fi networks can be very dangerous, especially during the holiday season. Public Wi-Fi can potentially grant hackers' access to your usernames, passwords, texts and emails. For instance, before you join a public Wi-Fi titled "Apple Store," make sure you first look around to see if there's actually an Apple Store in your vicinity, and thus, confirm that it is a legitimate network. To help stay secure, you should always be on the lookout for the lock symbol on your webpage.

#### 2. Look for the lock symbol on websites.

When visiting a website look for the "lock" symbol before entering any personal and/or credit card information. The lock may appear in the URL bar, or elsewhere in your browser. Additionally, check that the URL for the website has "https" in the beginning. These both indicate that the site uses encryption to protect your data.

#### 3. Know what the product should cost.

If the deal is too good to be true, then it may be a scam. Check out the company on ResellerRatings.com. This site allows users to review online companies to share their experiences purchasing from those companies. This will give you an indication of what to expect when purchasing from them.

#### 4. Use a one-time use credit card number.

Many banks are now offering a single use credit card number for online shopping. This one-time number is associated with your account and can be used in place of your credit card number. This way, if the credit card number becomes exposed, it cannot be used again. Check with your credit card company to see if they have this option available.

#### 5. Keep your computer secure.

When using your computer to do your holiday shopping, remember to keep your anti-virus software up to date and apply all software patches. Never save usernames, passwords or credit card information in your browser and periodically clear your offline content, cookies and history. You will want to keep your computer as clean as possible for online shopping. The world of online shopping can bring lots of new products to your door step and can prove to be a lot of fun finding that special gift. Just remember to be careful so that you don't make your data a special gift to cybercriminals.

#### 6. Always use credit cards for purchases.

Avoid using your ATM or debit card while shopping. In the event that your debit card is compromised, criminals can have direct access to the funds from your bank account. This could cause you to miss bill payments and overdraw your account. When using a credit card, you are not using funds associated with your bank account. This means you are better protected by your credit card company's fraud protection program. If you pay off the credit card balance each month, you won't pay interest and your banking information will be protected.

#### 7. Don't leave purchases in the car unattended.

Criminals can be watching and will consider breaking into your car to get the merchandise you just purchased. If you must leave some items in your car, consider leaving them in the trunk or glove compartment rather than in a visible location.



#### 8. Beware of "porch pirates."

When shopping online and receiving purchases by mail, make sure you are always tracking your packages. The US Postal Service, FedEX and UPS all have systems to track your packages, and all three utilize tracking numbers that can be used to figure out where your item is and when it should be delivered to your home. However, the only surefire way to thwart porch pirates is to not have packages delivered to your home at all. Consider having your holiday packages delivered to a family member, your workplace, or a trusted neighbor!
