## TRANSPORTATION REGISTRATION 2019/2020

Families are advised that Bus Registration for the 2021-22 school year will run from **May 1**st through

June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2021. To ride a district school bus, all new and returning riders must complete a registration form each year. Registration may be initiated by using our on-line bus registration form. This can be accessed at <a href="https://www.mpsd.ca">www.mpsd.ca</a> and clicking on the 'Transportation' link on the Home page. The Transportation office will be closed in the summer

months. However, on-line registrations may still be submitted throughout July and August.

## PLEASE RETURN REPORT CARD ENVELOPES

A reminder to sign and return the report card envelope to your child's teacher as soon as possible. These cards and envelopes will be used for the final reporting term in June.

## YEAR END FIELD TRIPS

Some classrooms are planning year-end fields trips for their students. We would like to communicate to families that extra special attention is being put into the planning of these field trips so that they are Covid-Safe. Some extra safety precautions are: wearing masks on busses, staying in our health region, only having one cohort attend (and ride a bus), no parent volunteers, sticking to outdoor field trips, and all the other things like handwashing, distancing and staying home when sick. These special safety precautions will be communicated to families on field trip forms when they go home. As well, it's always a parental option to not have your child attend as we will make alternatives for your child here at school. Also, please be aware that not all teachers are planning year-end field trips.
