### STUDENT SNACK/LUNCH REMINDERS

A reminder to parents that we are a 'pack-in-pack-out' school, meaning that any wrappers or garbage items from snacks and lunches will be put back into lunch kits to go home for disposal and recycling. We would also like to remind families that we do not have the ability to heat food or water for your children's lunches. If your child prefers food items that need to be heated, we recommend purchasing a thermos to facilitate this. Our water fountains are still not functioning due to Covid-19, but we do have excellent filtered water bottle filling stations so please do not forget to pack a water bottle for your child. Finally, we encourage parents to pack healthy snacks and lunches to help feed their busy brains and bodies with the right kind of fuel they will need for a long day at school.

### PARKING LOT REMINDERS

As you all know our parking lot is very busy in the morning and afternoon. We encourage families to walk



to school if possible. For families that are not within walking distance, please do not park in our staff parking areas. We have a large staff and need every space that we have. When dropping off or picking up, please mind the sign in our parking lot that outlines which lane is for pick-up/drop-off and which lane is for passing through. For new families, the lane closest to the school is for busses only. Please do not park, drop off or pass through via this lane.

#### **MORNING SUPERVISION**

Some of you may have noticed that we have increased our morning supervision around the building. A reminder to parents that morning supervision begins at 8:15am. If your son or daughter arrives at school independently before 8:15am, please be aware that there won't be supervision at that time.

#### **AFTERNOON PICK-UP**

For parents that come to AME to pick up their children in the afternoon, please be mindful that we usually have a few classes outside doing PE, DPA or free time. Please do not intermingle with our classes, even if it's your son or daughter's class. Kindly wait near the classroom door for dismissal time. When parents intermingle with students during instructional time outside, it is very difficult for teachers and staff to know who is who, limiting their ability to maintain school safety for our kiddos.

#### **WEST COAST RECESS**

AME is a 'West Coast Recess' school meaning we go outside at break times, rain or shine. This means it's extremely important that our students dress for the weather. Boots and rain jackets are needed when it's wet, warm jackets when it's cold, and the ability to take off layers when it's hot. This can be tough to manage in September with frequently changing weather patterns but keeping an eye on the weather forecast will help with this. Please note we do have the odd 'inside day' when there is extreme weather or a wild animal in the area.

If we start to move in the right direction in BC with regards to transmission, we will consider starting in-person assemblies once again.

#### **FIELD TRIPS**

Many classrooms are excited to be able to attend field trips this year. Please be aware that we will have Covid-Safety protocols in place for field trips. While we can use volunteers once again, there are additional safety precautions that we need to follow. If your son or daughter has a field trip planned, safety precautions will be communicated well in advance of the trip.

#### **MASKS (Grade 4-6)**

Parents, please remember to pack a mask for your child if they are Grade 4-6. While we have extras for those that forget, we do not have enough to supply those that forget every day.
