"The beaver reminds us that we all have gifts and a purpose in this world. It is through the love of knowledge that we find wisdom."




We are very excited to have Jacob Firlotte, MPSD Indigenous Liaison, join us at AME for Indigenous

Boys Group. Jacob has been visiting us every Wednesday to spend time with our primary and intermediate groups. Our boys have reported that the group is super fun and that Jacob is a very "inspirational" man.

Division 9 has been learning about the life cycle of salmon. On January 25th, the Department of Fisheries and Oceans Canada delivered 55 chum salmon eggs.



Throughout the weeks, Division 9 has noticed the eggs developing eyes "Eyed Eggs", developing their bodies and looking ready to hatch. Just last week all the eggs, but two, hatched. The hatched eggs are called "Alevins". The alevins have an orange sac on their bellies that will feed them for at least a month. Once the sac disappears and the alevins have grown into small silver fish, they become "Fry" and we will start to feed them ground up krill. Around mid-April, the fry will have developed enough and be



ready to be released into the creek at the Silverdale Creek Wetlands. Division 9 will then take the fry to the creek as a class and release them.


